PROPOSAL:

The Fayetteville Fire Department will be receiving an Assistance to Firefighter's Grant Award from The Federal Emergency Management Agency in the amount of \$120,736. The Fire Department would like to utilize the revenue from this grant and the additional funding of \$30,184 from Fire Act 833 to complete the outfitting of all firefighters with wildland gear. These purchases will be vital to the efficient and effective operation of Wildland Fire Calls.

RECOMMENDATION:
